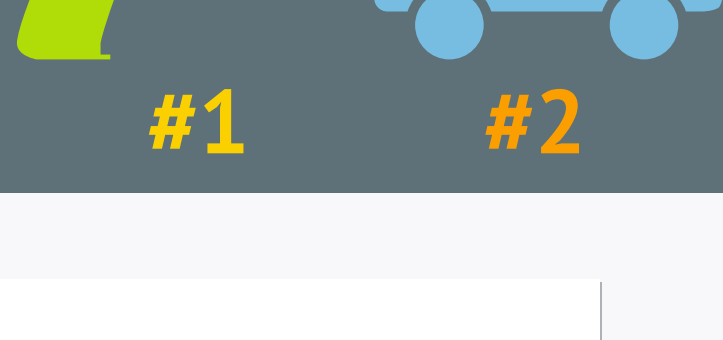

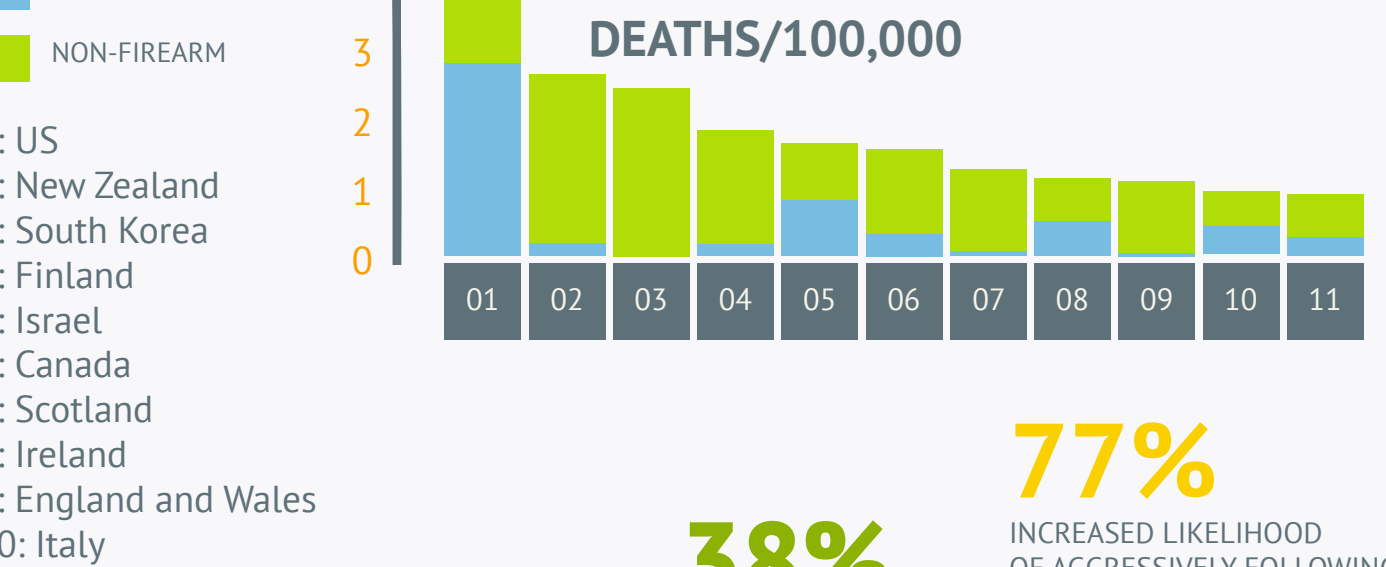
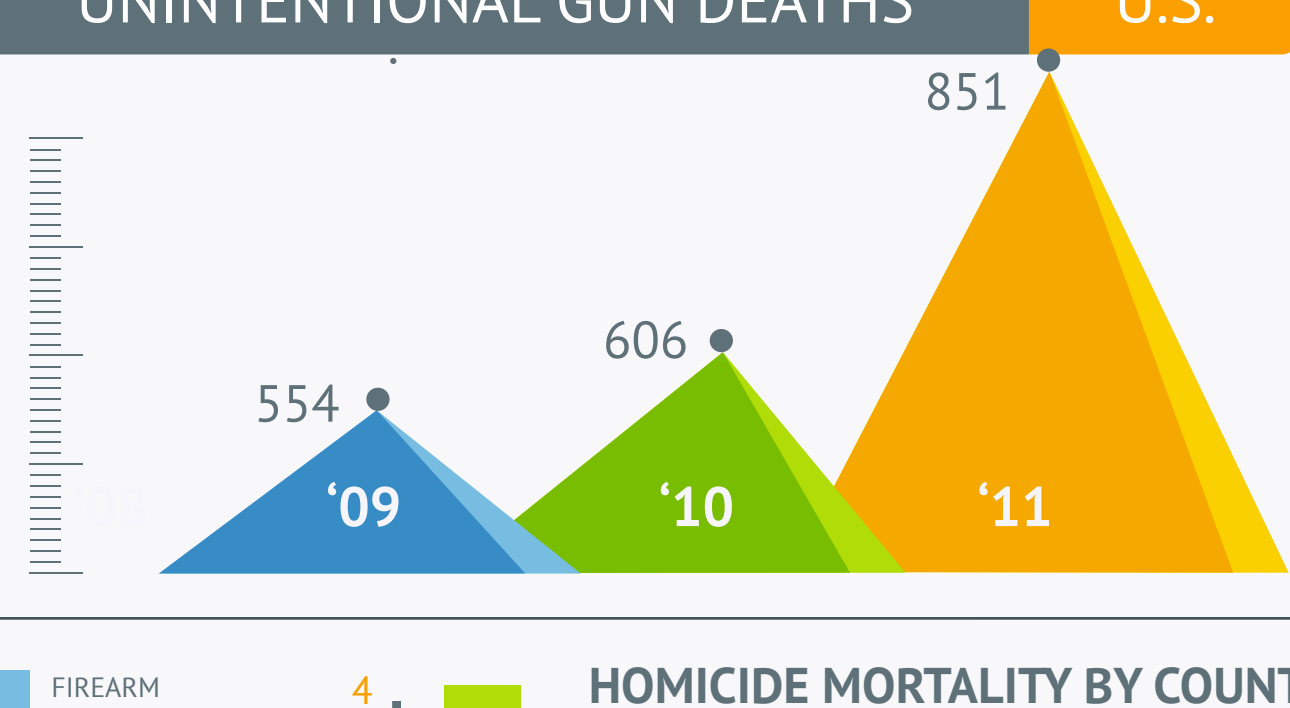

1ST AMENDMENT V. 2ND AMENDMENT:

- 1993** New England Journal of Medicine publishes extensive research finding by CDC's National Center for Injury Prevention clearly showing that rather than confer protection, guns kept in the home are associated with an increase in the risk of homicide by a family member or intimate acquaintance.
- 1995** National Rifle Association campaigns to eliminate the CDC's National Center for Injury Prevention which published the study.
- 1996** Congressman Jay Dickey (R-AR) adds the following language to the 1997 appropriations omnibus bill: "None of the funds made available for injury prevention and control at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention may be used to advocate or promote gun control." The budget passes, prohibiting government research and discussion of the second largest cause of death for Americans age 15-44. In the 17 years that follow, the CDC's funding for firearm injury prevention falls 96%.
 - The Dickey Amendment** with support from the NRA removes \$2.6 million (the exact cost of the CDC's Firearm study) from the CDC's budget for the following year.
 - The American Psych. Association** issues a statement saying, "Research on the prevention of firearm related injury...has come under attack from...the NRA. APA is advocating against the Dickey amendment."
- 2012** Jay Dickey Reverses Position and joins Mark Rosenberg, former director of the CDC's National Center for Injury Control and Prevention, to write a Washington Post Op-Ed saying, "We were on opposite sides of the heated battle 16 years ago, but we are in strong agreement now that scientific research should be conducted into preventing firearm injuries and that ways to prevent firearm deaths can be found without encroaching on the rights of legitimate gun owners. The same evidence-based approach that is saving millions of lives from motor-vehicle crashes, as well as from smoking, cancer and HIV/AIDS, can help reduce the toll of deaths and injuries from gun violence."
